Information about social assistance in plain language



The City of Bern's welfare service is here to help.

Information about the welfare service:

- You can ask the welfare service for help.
- The welfare service is here to help you and your family.
- Appointments with the welfare service are free.
- You can take someone with you to your appointment, for example someone who can translate for you.
- There is nothing you have to do after the first appointment.
- After the first appointment, you can say: 'Yes, I would like social assistance' or 'No, I would not like social assistance'.
- If you say: 'Yes, I would like social assistance', the welfare service will help you to register.
- The welfare service will keep your information safe.
- The welfare service will need to talk to other departments about your case. The welfare service will let you know that they are doing this.

Please note: do you need money from the welfare service because of coronavirus? You will not lose your residence permit.

Questions and answers

QUESTION: I need social assistance because of coronavirus. Will I lose my residence permit?

ANSWER: No. You will not lose your residence permit.

However: the welfare service must inform the City of Bern's residents' register office of

- how long you receive social assistance
- why you are receiving social assistance
- how much money you receive/have received from the welfare service
- → Have you only received social assistance because of coronavirus?

 The City of Bern's residents' register office can still extend your residence permit.

QUESTION: I am receiving social assistance. Can I (still) get a Swiss passport?

ANSWER: No. You cannot be receiving money from the welfare service. First you will need to pay back all the money you received from the welfare service.

However: if you have a disability or a long-term health condition and are receiving money from the welfare service, then you can ask for a Swiss passport.

QUESTION: Do I always have to pay back money I receive from the welfare service?

ANSWER: No. You only have to pay the money back to social services if

- you receive money from an insurance company at a later date
- you sell your home, for example, and now have money
- you have more money at a later date and do not need that much money to live on
- you are working and earning money, for example, and do not put this on the registration form for social assistance
